Started the season at the Avondale medal and came 12th

last Walker Cup team and in the squad.

2nd (for the 2nd year running!) in the Courage Trophy with scores of 70 and 68.

Part of the winning Hampshire six-man team yesterday at Stoneham, the team was a staggering 20 under par! They will now compete in the National County finals later on in the year, but without me as I am turning Professional.

My first event as a pro was the Jamega Pro Golf Tour at Magnolia Park on 19/20 July. I tied for 2nd place with scores of 70 and 69, which was 7 under. The winner was Jordan Smith of Woodcote Park at 8 under.

Reaches the semi-finals of the English Women's Open Mid-Amateur Championships at Bristol and Clifton Golf Club – 1-4 July

Raffi played some great golf to make it as far as the last four semi-finalists. Raffi won the 3rd and 4th holes with birdies, and was up for most of her match with Germany's Michele Holzwarth. Her opponent hit a spectacular drive over trees onto the green at the 288-yard 15th to get back to all square, and finally won on the 18th. Michele finished 2nd in the final to Sian James of the host club, Bristol and Clifton GC.

COLIN WALSH



Colin won the Men's Club Championships at Liphook, the youngest in the club's history. 2009's winner was Sam Hutsby.

Played in the Henry Cooper Junior Masters at Nizels Golf Club, made the cut by 5 shots but unfortunately in the third round both his playing partners became ill, one not even starting and the other giving up after 8 holes, leaving him with a course marshal marking his card, making it a slow round in blazing sun, and dropping 3

shots in the round. In the pm round he was moved up to another group and shot 2 under seeing him finish 17th, 5 shots off the lead. Played in the Lee-on-the-Solent Pro Am and shot 4 under par with his team finishing 4th, his score equalled the winning Pro score.

He has also represented the county U18 squad in the South East Boys' Team Champs, individually finishing in 6th place with many England U18 boys trailing behind.

He has played for Hampshire Colts again, this time against Sussex Colts.

His winning run continued with Colin winning both his matches in a close 6/5 win for the county. The team now has to go to play Kent in the title decider.

In July he will be playing in three major tournaments: two junior events, the South East Boys' Champs at Moor Park, the English Boys' U18 Championships at Woodhall Spa for the Carris Trophy and the Nations Cup; and one men's event, the English Amateur Championships at Little Aston and Sutton Coldfield nr Birmingham.

Colin came 5th in the Carris Trophy, the English Boys' Open Amateur Stroke Play Championship at Woodhall Spa on Tuesday 20 July with a level par result over four rounds.

He was chosen to play his maiden Boys' Home International against Wales and Ireland in Southernness, Scotland on 3-5 August.
